- National departments cover areas including economic and social issues, employment rights, trade union organisation and international relations



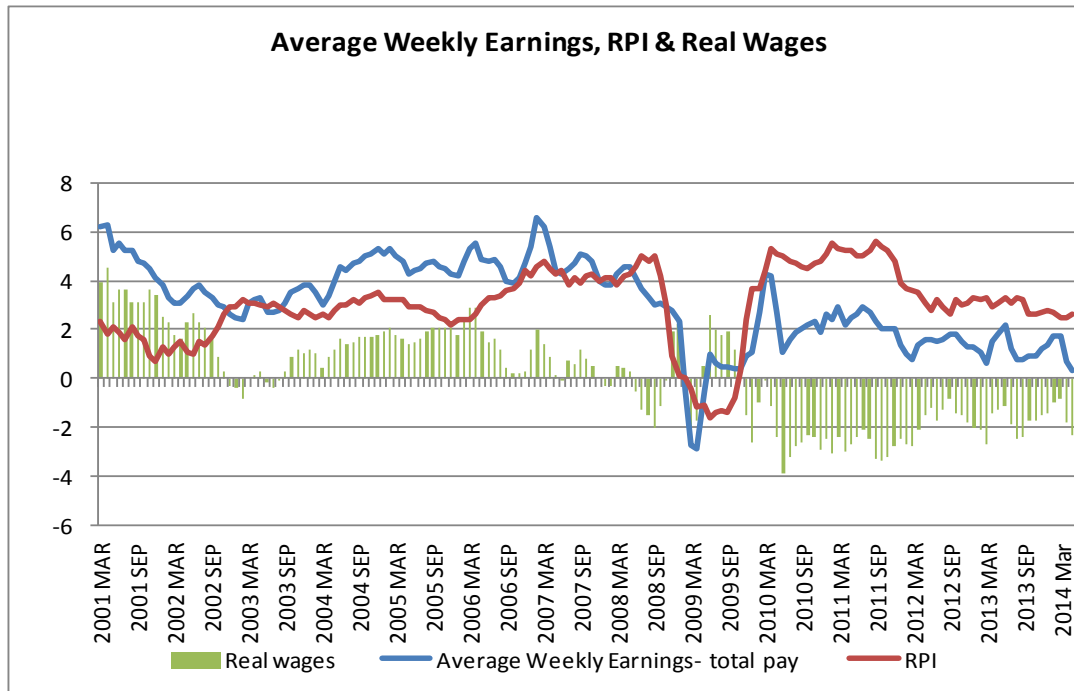
Key TUC priorities
